Subject pronouns - *he, she, it, you, they, we* and *I* - are used in place of subject nouns.

Uses

- singular (one)

Example

I am hungry. I want to eat some rice.

Jim is from the USA. He is American.

Sue is Korean. She is from Korea.

Taipei is a city. It is in Taiwan.

The teacher is working. You are teaching English.

- plural (more than one)

Sue and Jim are friends. They like each other.

The students are studying. We are studying English.

My friends are sitting down. You are sitting down.
